Women found an early, productive place in the activities of the Harvard College Observatory. Throughout the late 19th and early 20th century, as many as twenty women at a time made fundamental discoveries in astrophysics by examining glass photographic plates taken hour by hour, night after night, in both the northern and the southern hemispheres. The women's efforts led to a globally accepted classification for the stars that is still in use today, an understanding of the chemistry of the heavens, and a means for measuring distances across space.
